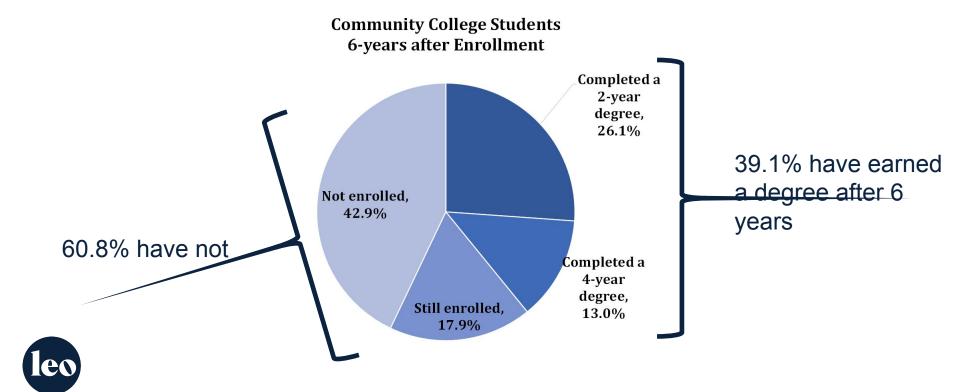

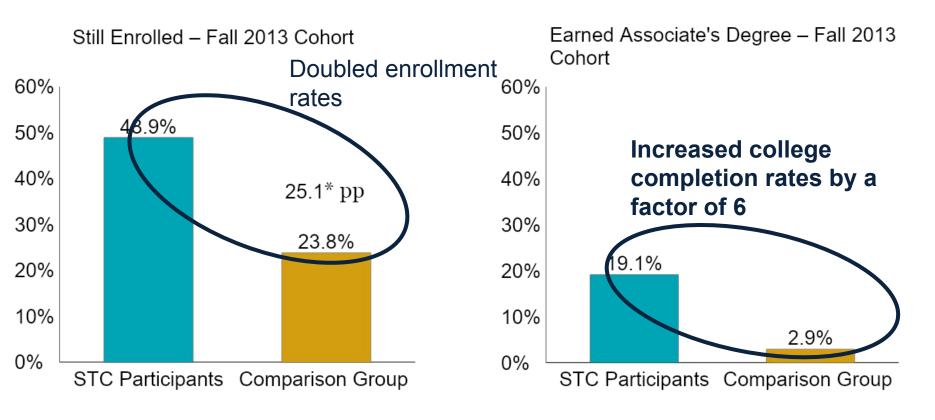

## **Evidence to Impact**

Local fundraising = expansion across all campuses to serve thousands more students

Federal success: securing the Postsecondary Student Success Grants (PSSG) in the federal budget

#### THE PROBLEM

#### POVERTY IS COMPLEX



Meet Rosa

Single mom
Three young kids
No high school diploma
No job
No car
About to be evicted

To move out of poverty, Rosa needs to:

Acquire credentials that lead to an employable skill
Find quality, affordable daycare
Manage her time
Address her transportation needs
Address her housing needs

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But this is made more difficult because:

English is not her first language
One of her children has a disability
She has a parent with healthcare needs
She has untreated trauma from her childhood

#### THE INTERVENTION





Meet the Padua Program at Catholic Charities Fort Worth

Holistic and individualized services
First address basic needs
Financial assistance
Referrals
Skill-building
Coaching and mentoring



#### SUMMING UP WHAT WE FIND

Those offered Padua were 25% more likely to report being employed full time

Unemployed individuals earned 46% more

Unstably housed individuals were 60% more likely to have stable housing

Sharp decline in credit card debt: \$420/month

Improved health conditions: 53%





## **Evidence to Impact**

 Taking Evidence to Action: LEO testified before the House Ways and Means Subcommittee discussing impact of Padua.

 Maximize Impact: building national office and take program to national replication and scale.

Advances collective learning and contributes to existing research.

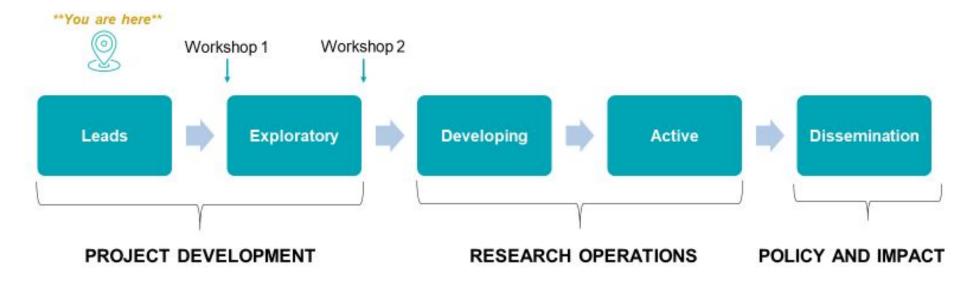
Commits to incorporating research design into day-to-day operation.

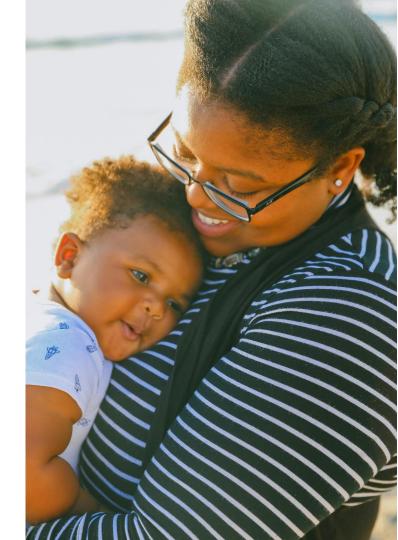

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# **Study #1: Shelter Diversion**

- Research questions:
  - (1) Does the Shelter Diversion Program reduce the likelihood of individuals and families using emergency shelters or street outreach (signaling on-the-street homelessness) in both the short and long term?
  - (2) How does participation in the Shelter Diversion Program impact broader outcomes such as housing stability, employment, and criminal justice involvement?

## Study Outcomes

**Primary:** Emergency Shelter Stays, Days in Shelter. Street Outreach Engagement, Additional CAP Helpline Calls

**Secondary:** Involvement in Other Homelessness: tice Involvement, Evictions, Education STRATEGIES TO END HOMELESSNESS; redit Outcomes, Neighborhood Qualit Support Programs



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# **Study #2: Housing Stability Collaborative**

Using **predictive data analytics** to identify households in the very early stages of a housing crisis
